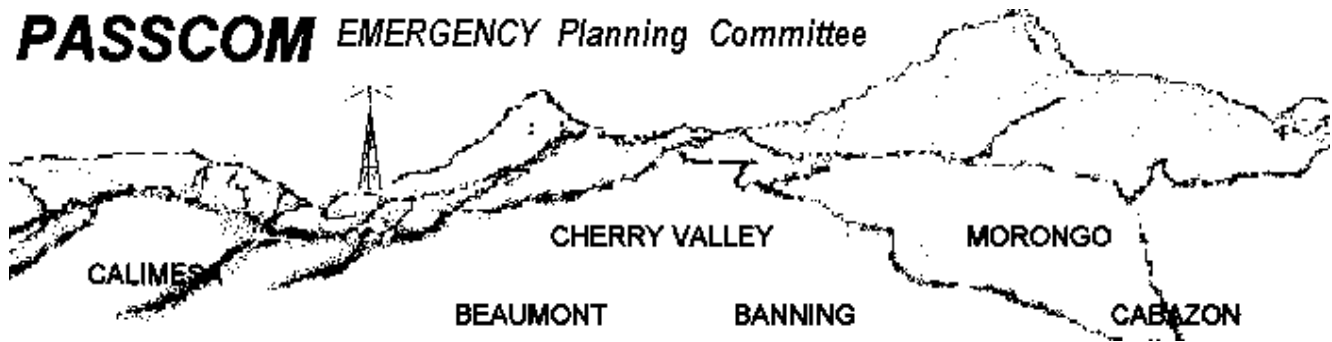

1. Welcome:

Vice President Mike Barron welcomed everyone in attendance.

Bob Ewert announced he would like PASSCOM members to review the Emergency Preparedness posters, which Debbie Franklin and he placed on the walls of the room. Then he asked each member to vote as to which poster should be used for the Banning Disaster Expo Fair in April. The top three poster makers were to receive a prize.

Vice President Mike Barron introduced and welcomed Mayor Bob Botts from the City of Banning.

2. Self-Introductions:

Everyone present made self-introductions.

3. Approval of the Minutes:

Bob Ewert made a motion to approve the Minutes. Vicki Hale seconds the motion. Everyone was in agreement, the Minutes were approved.

4. Treasurers Report:

PASSCOM has a bank balance of \$3,870.82. The Banning Bench has \$1,712.16 on deposit. The balance, \$2,158.66 belongs to PASSCOM.

Reports:

Riverside County Fire OES/Gina Moran-McGough:

Riverside County has received a Federal Declaration for the damage from the winter storm in January of 2010. This is the result of the State and the Federal Governments meeting. Debbie Franklin asked how to qualify for the relief. Gina has sent out an email to any who had already contacted the county with additional information. Debbie and Gina will speak concerning this issue.

CERT Field Day to be held on March 13th. The County EOS has 135 participants signed-up to attend.

The April CERT Class to be conducted by the County is full at 40 participants. You may sign-up for the waiting list by telephone the County EOS.

The email concerning a warning from Chief Hawkins is a fraud. Peter Lent and Chief Hawkins have written a letter so stating and sent the letter out.

PASSCOM Polo Shirt/Vicki Hale & Mike Simon:

An overview was presented describing the PASSCOM Polo Shirt project. A sign-up sheet was passed around for anyone who wanted to sign-up for a shirt or make changes to their order. Mike Simon will take the order to Custom Design Uniforms to have the shirts made. PASSCOM members will pay for the shirts when Mike delivers them to the PASSCOM meeting.

Banning Disaster Expo Fund Raiser/Bob Ewert:

Bob Ewert has order a hand cranked Radio/Flash Light with cell phone charger to show PASSCOM. The Radio/Flash Light has not arrived. He will have the Radio for the next meeting.

6. Presentation:

Program Chairman Mitch White introduced Lt. Roman Finale from the California Highway Patrol. Roman talked briefly about the conditions of Haiti and Chile. People resort to survival mode when food and water is no longer available.

New Traffic Laws—Roman was disappointed he did not receive the PowerPoint presentation in time for this presentation. When he receives the presentation he will bring to PASSCOM. Roman discussed the following Commercial Laws:

- 1) DUI's : Law Enforcement will be cracking down on DUI's. If found guilty, the Court may impose an ignition-locking device to check for alcohol. One will have to pay to have the device installed, pay to use the device and pay to have the device removed. In July a study will be conduct to

evaluate the effectiveness of the program. Any tampering with the device, the DMV will be notified.

- 2) Slow Down and Move Over: for Emergency Vehicles, both yellow and red lights. One must slow down and move over. In addition, CAL Trans and City Vehicles are included. Roman suggested that this law is one everyone should be aware of and be doing.
- 3) TV Screens and Entertainment Center installed in vehicles. These centers cannot be visible to the driver's seat in the vehicle. It is a violation for the driver to view an entertainment center while driving.
- 4) Crime against Construction Workers—Assault & Battery. Crimes against construction workers, CAL Trans and Sub-Contractor are included.
- 5) Good Samaritan Law—The holes were closed in the law previously passed.
- 6) Payment Method: Transponders. New paid license plate.
- 7) Bicycles: You can now ride a bicycle without a seat if the bicycle is designed to ride the bicycle without the seat.

When "exempt" is on a license plate, the vehicle is an authorized emergency vehicle.

Discussion about the SUVs in AZ with cameras but without a person to stop speeders. This type of policy is illegal in CA.

Calimesa Blvd is now paved from Sandalwood to County Line Road.

Roman:

.Chrysler is trying to get back into the police car business.

Mike Simon:

Bob French did all the work to see that Calimesa Blvd was paved.

Bob:

Reminded the PASSCOM members to review the posters on the wall.

Dick:

The Radio Club Annual Field Day will be held on June 26th. When the flyer is available it will be placed on the PASSCOM Website.

Steve:

Reminded the PASSCOM members of the CERT Class to be held in April at Serrano Del Vista.

Carl:
