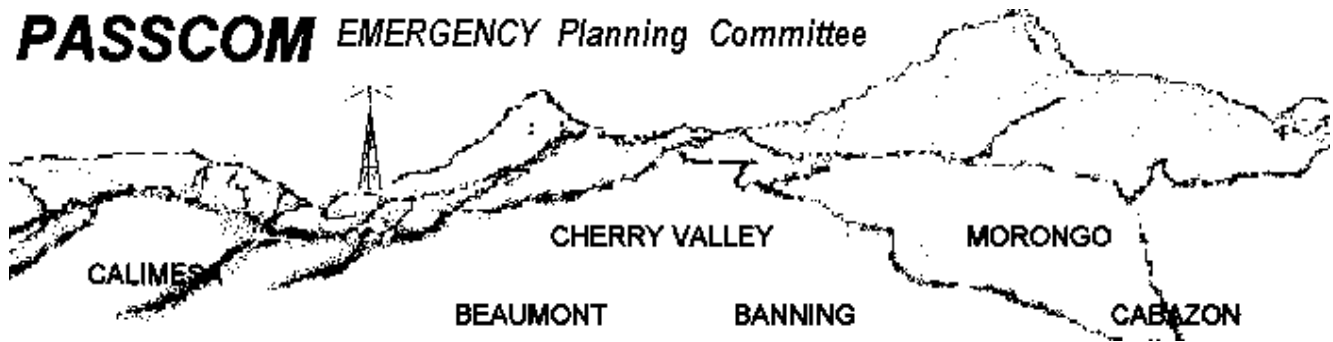

Banning Disaster Expo/Debbie Franklin:
