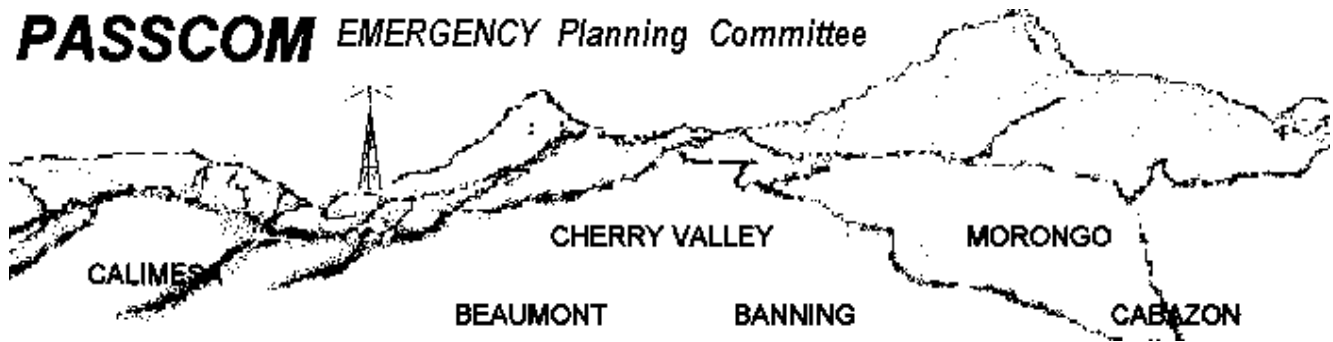

Beaumont is a PSAPC center; therefore, your landline telephone number and your address will come up immediately. Cell phone numbers are transferred immediately to CHP.

Reverse 911—automated computerized message. County has their own system and is independent from the city's systems.

City of Banning handles their cell phone numbers differently than Beaumont.
