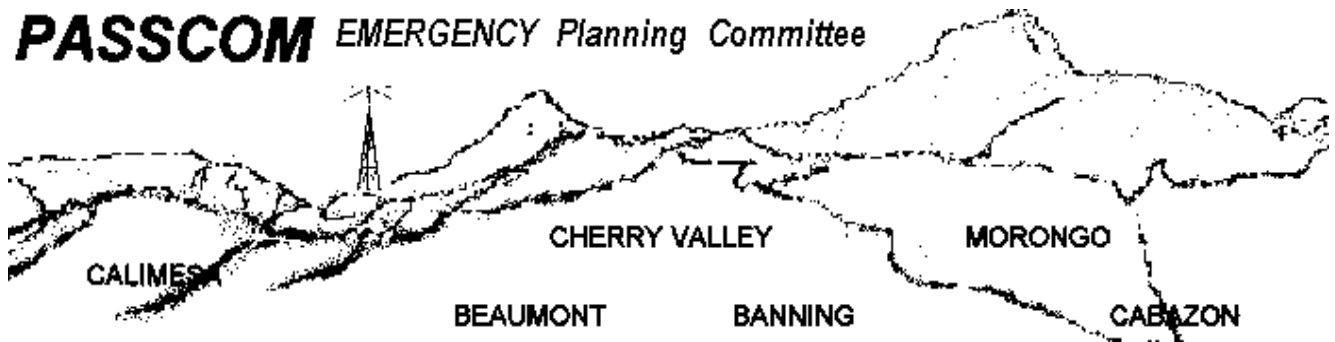

Key points of the new Disaster Corp Volunteer Program in Riverside County:

- The program will include 16 functions of a Disaster Worker with cross training in other areas
- Will provide affiliation within and outside of the community
- Disaster Corp Volunteers can be deployed by OES Volunteer Management
- This a pilot program in Riverside County being one of 5 in the state, with 200 expected volunteers in the coming year
- Rick and Mitch are affiliated through Beaumont City OES and community response
- Volunteer program is making positive progress
- Non-medical volunteer portion of the program was discussed
- When deployed expenses are paid similar to Red Cross but not exactly, travel to location is paid by the county affiliated in and return paid by area deployed to
